## **OTTAWA GROUP: TRADE FACILITATION MEASURES TAKEN IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19**

### COMMUNICATION FROM CANADA

The following communication, dated 28 September 2020, is being circulated at the request of the delegation of Canada on behalf of the Ottawa Group (Australia, Brazil, Chile, European Union, Japan, Kenya, Republic of Korea, Mexico, New Zealand, Norway, Singapore and Switzerland) for Members' information.

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1. Efforts by WTO Members to address the health and economic effects of the COVID-19 global pandemic have resulted in many changes to our domestic procedures for the administration of import and export transactions. In order to support the movement of essential and other goods across borders as smoothly as possible, some Members have implemented digital solutions to make cross-border business transactions more convenient and transparent while ensuring regulatory compliance. In addition, some Members have established "green lanes" to prioritize and expedite the customs clearance processes or have suspended customs duties and/or taxes on imports to reduce costs for users of these goods.

2. The Ottawa Group has compiled a list of a number of the measures its Members have implemented over the past half-year in response to COVID-19. We share these experiences to support identifying ways to take full advantage of the opportunities for trade facilitation in the Trade Facilitation Agreement and to promote best practices for the implementation of the TFA. We look forward to hearing the experiences of other WTO Members in upcoming Trade Facilitation Committee meetings.
